

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The easy level has simplified language, picture clues, and more space for the student to write the answers. This makes it suitable for younger students or slightly older students who need extra assistance.






The extension sheet has fewer picture clues. It is not sets a higher level of vocabulary. It often includes activities are habe had order and spelling rules.

If the children are working at their correct evel, v should all take about the same amount of time to complete the work sheets.







