

How Many Continents?

A continent is a large landmass on Earth. There are seven continents in the world. Some geographers combine Europe and Asia (Eurasia) which makes six continents in total!



How Big?

Even though continents are said to be large landmasses, they are all different sizes. Look at the numbers on the map above. The largest continent is 1 and the smallest is 7!

How Many People?

Population means how many people live in each continent. Look at the population line. It ranks the continents in order from the largest to the smallest population.

Antarctica has the smallest population because nobody permanently lives there!




