

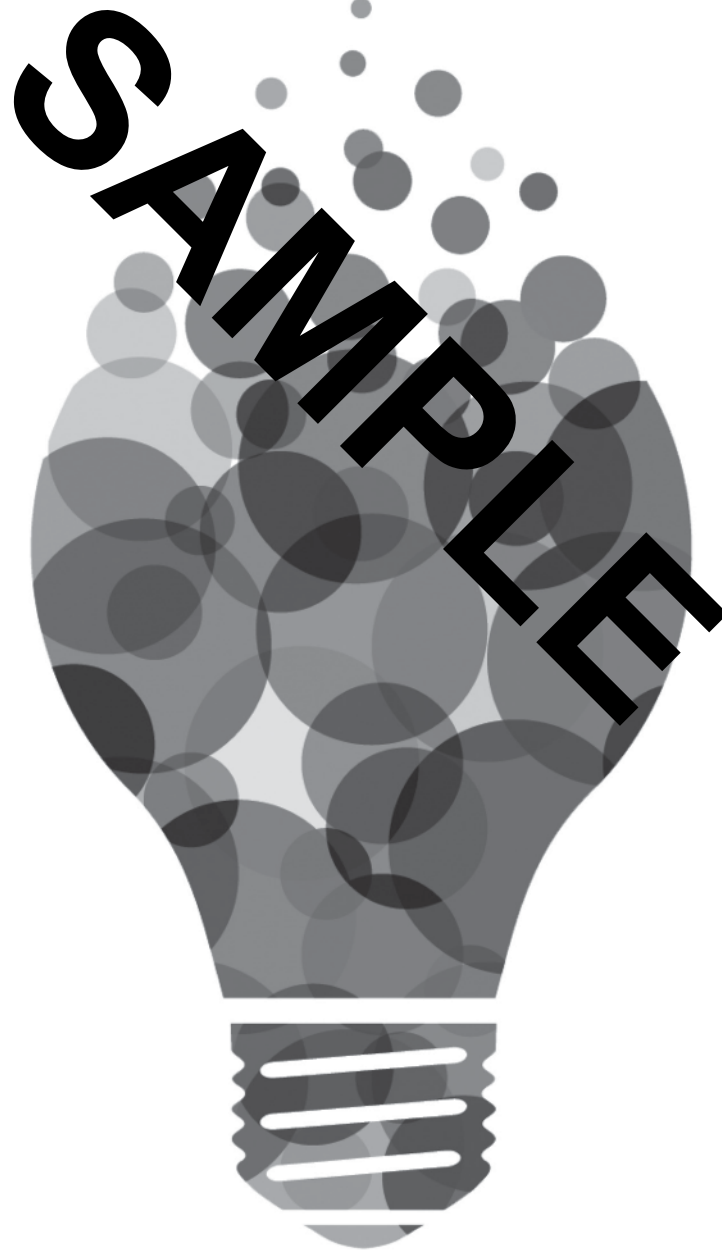

# LET'S GET QUIZZICAL 2

Thematic quizzes and research activities for primary students.



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# Introduction

'Let's Get Quizzical' Book 2 is a collection of thematic research quizzes on a wide variety of subjects chosen to suit students in the 7 to 9 age range. Each page of quiz questions invites children to explore numerous facets of a topic, using a mix of resource materials: books, newspapers, journals, atlases, as well as the internet. At the bottom of each quiz page a research section is offered for extension work. These "Research and Report" activities encourage students to investigate a topic in more depth than the quiz questions allow. The quiz activities in this book will not only provide children with a useful and interesting store of general knowledge, they will also foster solid research techniques, which will come in very useful in their further studies.

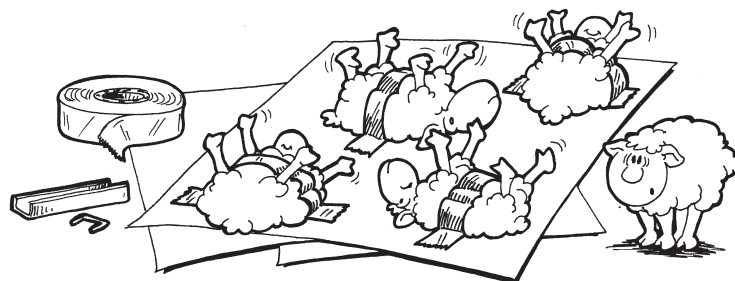
## Teachers should note that:

1. The activities are designed to be research quizzes. Many answers will not be within the general knowledge of the student.
2. A lesson on research materials and techniques may be useful before beginning the quizzes. A brainstorming session on places to find information can encourage children to look beyond the internet as the sole source of knowledge. Other useful sources of information you may like to mention are: specialist dictionaries and encyclopedias, The Guinness Book of Records, atlases, language dictionaries, street directories, books of quotations, thesauruses, almanacs, yearbooks, identification guides, and governmental sources of information. It may also be useful to revise online searching techniques. These techniques can help the children avoid reading through irrelevant information to find one fact. Finally, the importance of reading an assignment carefully before tackling it should be stressed. Students can save themselves a lot of time and effort by identifying questions that could be answered from the same reference source BEFORE they start hunting out information. To reinforce the habit of careful reading, some of the questions are answered within the page itself - a format designed to reward organised quizzers!
3. Many of the questions are structured in such a way as to encourage students to rely on their own logic. For example, with a question asking "Which dog is bigger, a Chihuahua or a Bull Terrier?", it should not be necessary for students to find the average size of both dogs. If they find a reference to the Chihuahua's lack of size, they can then deduce that a Bull Terrier would be the bigger dog. Students should be encouraged to see this method of answering questions as a logical way to approach problems. In order to develop these skills, it is suggested that students be told all questions must be answered, even if they are unsure of the answers.
